I would like to sincerely thank all of these gentlemen for their efforts throughout the year. This is a thankless task with constant changes to personnel and games. Shooey and Dennis, took the challenges in their stride with only the occasion call to vent a bit. The development of our Referees under Brett and Scott's tuition continues, with many a head scratch and stunned look, with the numerous "what if's" that frequented trainings this year.

The introduction of the assistant U19 coordinator was introduced after an overwhelming response to the position vacant ad we ran for the role and taking on board the feedback from a number of previous holders of this role in the time it took to do the role fully. I hope with the introduction of this new role, it will make the role less time consuming as well as giving Jeff and Charl a sounding board within the committee. I wish them all the very best for the year and remind them that my phone is always on.

Referee Abuse

Unfortunately, Referee abuse was not eradicated this year. With numerous reports coming in from various areas about fools who wanted to take away the enjoyment of a good game of rugby.

The new blood in the executive and CGAC this year took a more forceful approach to some areas of abuse issue, with the results being that we the ACTRRA now have a voice on the ACTJRU tribunal. Along with this voice we also get access to the ACTJRU shame file.

I am unapologetic about the methods used to achieve these results, however an very grateful to the ACTJRU Executive and in particular Mick Pini for their ability to see our point of view and work with us to ensure that our referees were protected from the idiots.



Plans are already underway for the 2014 season to again try and minimise the amount of abuse reports received.

Exchange Program

The Exchange program this year not only did the traditional New Zealand Exchanges with Ben Nelson travelling to the Waikato region and the ACTRRA receiving exchanges from Canterbury (Carl) and South Canterbury (Bevan). We also did 2 separate exchanges to the Southern Inland region.

These later exchanges although not as far or as long as the New Zealand trip still provided our members with a valuable opportunity to travel to a different area and referee outside their normal comfort zone.

Rob Whyte, Reece Henshaw, James Morris and Michael Rahilly all had the opportunity to Referee in the Southern Inland, while Brett Bowden and Scott Izod displayed their Referee coaching skills.

The inbound Exchange function for the New Zealand lads just happened to coincide with the 2nd New Zealand v France test. So a group of us sat down with the NZ lads and watch the game all barracking for the Frogs of course.

As usually the billeting was spread out amongst a few people all of whom I would like to sincerely thank you for opening your home to the NZ boys. We did however this year splurge on a Hire Car for the boys, which was a huge success. It gave them the ability to travel when they wanted, and to where they wanted; taking the pressure off the billets. The boys also got to attend the State of Origin game which they both loved.

We are looking at expanding the exchange program next year (funds permitting), with plans for an WA and Victoria exchange along with the traditional NZ trips. However given we will have more exchanges coming in I would expect all members who have been on exchanges to be the first with their hands up to help.

ACTRRA Website & Social Media

With Social media taking over the world, the ACTRRA tried to get into that space. The idea was that being on Facebook would allow a better communication method to our younger members. Although we did not have the "likes" we would have liked, it was a starting point.

2014 will bring a bigger push to expand our communication to all members. So be prepared to see different aspects to the way we communicate. Webcasts, twitter, are all areas we are looking at using to get our message out to more and more members.

Once again, Dennis Beissner did a fantastic job at updating and maintaining the website, for his efforts I thank him.

Training and Referee Development Nights

Although the pre-season training sessions were well attended, the season trainings we patchy. We need to encourage all referees to attend as many training sessions as they can. This year Brett introduced a skills session to the Thursday's day night training, which was of great benefit to all that attended. I personally would like to see thus continue next year as it got the grey matter going as well as the legs.

The development nights were again pretty well attended, although we always have room for more. The content put together by, Brett, Scott, Mark Snow and Shooey was of the usual high standard. With a few ideas in the pipeline for next year, we are hoping more will benefit from the experience of the presenters and the group at large.

This proved to be an extremely positive arrangement and one which is likely to be extended into the future. The association is also currently seeking a major sponsor for both out shorts, sleeve and off field kit. Although we have already put proposals to a number of companies, any other leads that members made have would be greatly appreciated.

I would also like to thank Geoff Palmer and Owen Keane for their efforts in organising the Presentation Dinner and the associated presentation that were used on the night.

A special congratulations to all winners of awards on the night especially Brad Dale who won the prestigious BAR Trophy, Dennis Beisnner who won the Jim Healy Trophy and Joe Whyte who was awarded the Will Boyle Memorial Trophy.

Coaching, Grading and Appointments Committee

SENIOR GRADES - 2013

The members of the Coaching, Grading & Appointments Committee for 2013 were: lan Schubert (Chairman), Brendan McCormick, Peter Langford, Jack Cunningham, Greg Saphin, Dave Mason, Wilf Hedley and Bill Teece. The committee met on two occasions to discuss various matters.

Dave Mason was absent for most of the season due to deployment by the Defence Department. Brendan McCormick was overseas for a large portion of the season and Allan Casey announced his retirement from Referee Coaching

Bill Teece joined the group during 2013 and assisted in Coaching during that time.

Grading Committee

Ian Schubert, Peter Langford & Greg Saphin formed the Grading Committee who met 3 times during the season to undertake the Grading of Referees. Thank you, Peter and Greg for your assistance.

The results of the Grading Committee saw Brad Dale, Liam King and Rohan Nishantha promoted to the A Panel. Sarah Corrigan was also reinstated to the A Panel after the birth of her son. Congratulations to all for this achievement.

Congratulations must also go to Mick Cleary, James Morris and Rob Whyte who were promoted to the B Panel and all other referees who moved up the Grading Panels.

Brodie Ingram in his 1st full year of Senior Grade also had a challenging year refereeing mainly Premier 3/4th Grade and the occasional Colts fixture. This resulted in him refereeing the Premier 4th Grade Grand Final. Well done Brodie.

ACTRU Competition

The first appointment for 2013 was on 25 January and this was followed by various trials & the Pacific Nations Cup. During this period referees were appointed in various roles as required by the ARU.

The S15 competition officially commenced on 16 February and Referees were appointed at all Brumbies home games to carry out the No4 and No5 role on a rotation basis with the No6 role being fulfilled by the Scholarship Referees.

ACTRRA Preseason Seminar was held on Sunday 3 March and again the method of appointing to the Grand Finals was explained and that it would remain the same as 2012. My observation this year suggests this process of appointing to the Grand Finals needs to be reviewed in early 2014.

This year the Chairman of the Coaching, Grading and Appointments Committee appointed to the following:

- Premier Division
- Monaro 1st and 2nd Division
- Women's
- U18 Div1 and Div 2

Each week 33 referees were required to fulfil our weekly roster of games. Although our actual Referee numbers for Senior Grades indicated we had 42 registered Referees the unavailability rate reduced this number significantly. This unavailability rate was in the range of 7 to 12 per week.

This shortfall was normally taken up by adult referees from the U19 ranks to fill in the holes left by moving referees off the U18 Div 1 & Div 2 games. I must thank the U19 Coordinator – Dennis Beissner for making them available and in turn leaving himself short.

Due to the movements of RMC & ADFA as well as other catch up games there was a further requirement to appoint referees to midweek night games. I would like to thank those who accepted this challenge in undertaking these games some of which were at short notice.

Out of town appointments were again an issue on occasion. Thank you to those referees who continually put your hands up to travel out into the bush.

Appointments - Early in the season it was recognised that there was an issue with the timely publishing of appointments this resulted in a meeting with the General Manager of Community Rugby – Craig Leseberg. The outcome of this meeting was that the Chairman of the Coaching, Grading and Appointments Committee was given the required access to undertake the appointments from scratch and send them out in a timely manner. This worked very well for 2013 and whether it is sustainable in the future remains to be seen. The arrangements with the Rugby Office have been further discussed to hopefully streamline the liaison between both parties.

In my view 2014 onwards is going to be very difficult for allocating referees to all matches due to the looming lack of numbers. This is not only a concern for the senior ranks as it is also relevant to the U19 referees.

Communications Kit – As we are all aware this is now an important part of refereeing. During the course of the season there were issues with the kit. This turned out to be an issue by both the Referees and the Rugby Office. Once these issues were identified the management of the kits improved. Different methods of using the equipment were conducted by Mark Snow over several weekends with the aim to have it working satisfactorily each weekend. Thank you Mark for your ongoing support in ensuring the three kits worked well.



Grand Finals – The 2013 Grand Final Series was a success in my view although our numbers were extremely stretched over the weekend of the Premier Division Major & Minor Semi Finals weekend due to the U19 Semi Finals and the 2nd Division Grand Final. I would like to commend all referees for their understanding and commitment during this time whether in the middle, AR or No4 & 5. I would like further to thank Mark Snow again for his continued effort each weekend to ensure the Communications Kit was working and fitted correctly.

Exchanges

New Zealand

Recommendations were also put forward for the exchanges and championships. Ben Nelson was selected to travel to Hamilton (Waikato) in NZ. Unfortunately no Coaches were available to travel this year & this is the second year that Coaches have not been available to travel to NZ. Ben has reported he gained valuable knowledge/experience as result of this exchange.

In return we had two Referees Carl Johnson and Bevan Newlands from Christchurch and Timaru respectively from 31 May to 9 June. Carl and Bevan Refereed in the Premier Division over two weekends and from feedback received they were happy with their appointments and the experience they shared during the exchange.

Domestic

The exchange with SIRRA continued this year and again was very successful. Over two weekends we saw two referees and one Coach visited Cootamundra and Wagga respectively. On 25 May, Michael Rahilly and James Morris went Cootamundra while Brett Bowden (Coach) visited Wagga. Over the weekend of 13 July, Rob Whyte and Reece Henshaw travelled to Cootamundra while Scott Izod (Coach) visited Wagga. In return we had two referees from SIRRA visit Canberra on each weekend. It is intended that this arrangement continue in the future. Well done to all concerned.

Tournaments/Championships

The following Referees/Coaches were nominated by the ACTRRA to attend championships:

- Darwin 7's Brad Dale & Liam King were nominated and selected for this tournament.
- National Women's Rugby Sevens Championship Liam King. Liam was selected to attend.
- Australian Schools Championships Rob Paloni (Referee) & Scott Izod (Coach). Scott was selected to attend.
- National Women's 15's Championships Ben Nelson (Referee) & Dave Mason (Coach) neither were successful although Sarah Corrigan was selected by the ARU to attend.
- National U16 Championship Brad Dale (Referee) & Peter Langford (Coach) Brad Dale was selected to attend.
- National Schools Rugby Sevens Tournament Liam King (Referee) & Greg Saphin (Coach) neither were successful.
- Central Coast 7's at Wyong NSW Ben Nelson, and Greg Saphin (Coach). Sarah Corrigan was nominated and selected. Sarah had to withdraw at the last minute due to work commitments.

Congratulations to all for their selection to attend the above Tournaments/Championships.



Referee Coaching

2013 saw our Senior Coaching Panel depleted due to the absence of two coaches and the retirement of another. I was disappointed with only 97 reports being submitted compared with 140 in 2012. Coaches were appointed each week and unfortunately reports were not being placed on RMMIS. Thank you to those who took the time to write the follow up reports on RMMIS.

In the later part of the season the Game/Plan/Review or GPR reporting system was made available but not fully utilised. This concept will be promoted from the commencement of the 2014 season. This, in my view, is a very good tool and if used correctly will be very valuable. As a result of the above not all Senior Grade Referees were sighted during the season which is very disappointing.

I would like to thank those Senior Coaches, Wilf Hedley & Bill Teece for their efforts in assisting the Coaching of the U19 Referees and then backing up later in the day for Senior Grades.

This year the Mentor Program was not continued due to lack of resources to implement it. Brett Bowden and Scott Izod conducted development sessions with our Senior Development group which consisted of: Ben Nelson, James Morris, Brad Dale, Angus Whittle, Brodie Ingram & Liam King.

Over the weekend of 25/26 May Greg Saphin and Bill Teece attended an ARU sponsored Level 11 Coaching Course in Sydney. Reports provided by both attendees indicate that is was well presented and very informative. It was recommended, if the opportunity arose again, we should take the option up.

Coaches Meetings - There were 5 scheduled meetings. These followed the Association's Development Night. The main topic was the same as the one presented at the Development Night meeting and was aimed at the Coaching aspect as to the Referee content. These meetings were not well attended and this is a pity as the sessions were in the main very informative. I would like to thank Scott Izod and Brett Bowden for their ongoing assistance and as well to Mark Snow when he was available.

Summary

This season has been a lengthy one commencing in January (Brumbies Trial) and the last appointment was on 2 November (ACT U20 Trials).

I will not be standing for this position in 2014. My intention is to step back from the front line to spend more time with my family and head off on a few trips in my caravan plus some other travel. Referee Coaching will still be an interest and you will certainly see me around the grounds during the coming seasons.

Finally I would like to thank the Executive, Referees, Referee Coaches and the Brumbies Office for their assistance not only in 2013 but for the past 23 years that I have been involved with the ACTRRA.

U19 Coaching and Grading Coordinator's Report

This was my first year in the role after it was left vacant at the end of 2012 due to Craig De Boos departure overseas. My aim for the year was to consolidate on the work of the previous coordinators; to improve communication with young referees; work with Mark Snow to implement a system to support his "stables and mentor model"; and use thumbnail reports to assist coaching the junior referees. Above all I was aiming to improve their base skill levels. During the year I guess I had mixed successes within these areas, some of which I will share.

Reports from previous coordinators have consistently mentioned that the year bought "challenges", and far be it for me to have that trend reversed this year! Increasingly high demands on young people's time; their propensity to communicate through new and strange methods all made for an interesting combination to liaise and have referees onto the field each weekend. Unfortunately I could not find an 'app' that did everything (but I did arrive at the realisation that the solution may lay somewhere with this thing called "Snapchat"?).

The Brumbies Administrator's report has provided a summary of the season's appointment statistics. In the wrap-up the statistics will show an excellent coverage rate. I thank Caitlin for her efforts juggling tasks and enduring the challenges of appointing junior referees.

Unfortunately there is however no way to hide, deny, or even sugar-coat the fact that far too many weeks during the season we did not achieve our aim to send out the primary junior appointments early in the week. There were many reasons for missing the targets, but we recognise that it was unsatisfactory, especially to the referees who were trying to schedule their weekend around their various commitments. Thankfully there has recently been open and fruitful dialogue with stakeholder to devise and agree on strategies so that we can improve in this area in 2014.

Stables

The mentoring and stables model was to be bolstered with a simple to use IT system that would allow better communication and information sharing about each referee amongst the stable heads; their assistants; and the referee coaches. Mark Snow and I were keen on the prospect of what this system could deliver as it showed immense potential to give the stables concept another boost forward. The system is being kindly built free of charge by one of our members, Vathsala, but due to his significant work commitments here and overseas; and some required system tweaks it meant things didn't quite go to plan and we were not able to have system ready to go 'live' until the end of the season. All is not lost from the efforts in the 2013 season however, because information collected during the season will be uploaded for historical purposes and will be a great prelude for the 2014 season.

Development

I was able to run both a pre-season and finals development seminars in April and August, held at Marist College. I thank the school for the use of their facilities and I especially thank those that gave up their time to give presentations; notably Anne Nelson, Owen Keane, Mark Snow, Rob Boyes and Mick Pini (ACTJRU). The attendance numbers were again a little disappointing with less than one-third of active junior referees making an appearance. It was great to see some new faces, but it was mainly filled by the same dedicated faces, so it somewhat seems we are still just 'preaching to the converted'. This is again a sign of the difficulties in attracting busy people to events such as these.

I was already aware that conducting mid-season seminars in previous years have inherently been poorly attended so I looked at other means to get the messages out to improve consistency in the refereeing. This year I concentrated on leveraging off previous years successes by asking and rallying the 'mentor and coaching' pool to provide as much one-



on-one help and guidance they could and to provide written individual thumbnail performance summaries of the referees they had spotted. I am pleased and ever so grateful to all of those that responded and were able to give up their valuable time to assist. I received an amazing 220+ thumbnail reports, which meant that almost every referee was spotted at least once during the season. Many were spotted 3 times during the season to monitor their progress. I thank all involved for their dedication. It would be unfair to name any individual without naming everyone, but the list is so extensive it would take up a lot of space! They know who they are, as do those that benefitted from their guiding advice.

By mid-season, the thumbnails showed a clear trend of a number of refereeing issues that needed attention. As a result I experimented with a monthly one-page newsletter emailed out and posted to the website (Gen-Y heaven?), which I affectionately called "The Whistler". It was aimed at highlighting the issues and giving tips and guidance on how they should be dealt with in a consistent manner. I would like to think this newsletter was some help to many referees. The feedback I received from referee coaches suggested that at least the parents of referees were reading them!

Abuse/Junior Judiciary

The season didn't get off to a good start with a major abuse incident at the College 7s that involved a heavy sanction for the miscreant. Unfortunately it didn't get any better with far too many incidents throughout the season. The miscreants don't seem to fear a sanction and the "No Abuse" message from previous years seemed to have fallen on deaf ears. It was getting very frustrating hearing of these events of our young ones being subjected to such bullying and demeaning tactics, and something needed to be done to address the issue before a more serious incident occurred.

The ACTRRA Executive and I were able to apply significant pressure and 'convince' the ACTJRU to deal with the issues more seriously. Fortunately we had their support and we were able to open communication lines with ACTJRU and the Junior Judiciary to gain a better understanding and knowledge that offenders were dealt with judicially (ACTRRA was also able to change some of its processes to assist ACTJRU cite the offenders).

It was refreshing that the judiciary on its own initiative invited Paul Scholtens into the judicial inner sanctum to act as an adviser to assist them from a refereeing perspective. This was a significant step forward and I thank the ACTRRA executives for supporting and assisting me to bring the issue to a heightened level with ACTJRU. Equally my thanks extend to the ACTJRU for doing their part in trying to eliminate abuse and remove offenders. I think that further improvements with transparency could be achieved, and I hope ACTRRA pursues these in the future.

Accolades

During the season I was pleased to see many talented referees coming through the ranks, and also many that put the effort in and made significant improvement over the season. There is still work to be done to continue to improve pathway and U19 law knowledge and game management, and this becomes increasingly difficult with the decline in the number of active level 1 referee coaches. I hope and implore more senior referees to consider gaining these qualifications and helping out the junior ranks. I thank all the referees for giving it their best this season and a special thank you to the many referees who officiated multiple games on many weekends to fill gaps. In particular thanks to Joe Whyte, Chase Loadsman, and Mitchell Beissner who refereed more than 20 games in the 14 round junior season.

Many of the appointment gaps this year were at the higher age groups, especially U16 to U14s, due to a number of mature-aged and experienced referees not being available. This meant that some young referees were given an opportunity to step above their usual panel assignments. This held an element of risk but fortunately, in the main, it



worked out to ensure games were covered. Though I would caution all young referees to not be too ambitious to climb to games above your ability, but rather, to gain experience and learn incrementally to ensure you're prepared and ready for the next step when it comes. This same issue is likely to be repeated in 2014 if experienced referees to do not return or if more are lost from refereeing.

A special note on the achievements of Reuben Keane, who officiated at the NSW State U13 Championships. His refereeing impressed the referee coordinators and he was selected to referee the grand final. Reuben was 14 ½ at the time, so this is a great achievement and he is just one of many young referees to watch for the future. Well done Reuben. Congratulations also to Sam Quirk, Brock Logue, Mitchell Colbert, and Leo Kaczmarek for being selected for officiating duties at the U12 PSSA State tournament held in the ACT during October.

Congratulations to all of the referees that had the honour of refereeing a junior grand final. There were some particularly close and exciting games and the manner in which some referees coped with the pressure to give their best performance and allowed the teams to dictate the result was particularly satisfying. The grand finals did however highlight the (understandable) inexperience of referees acting as ARs. Despite the AR level 1 and 2 courses being held, not enough took up the opportunity to learn this 'less sexy' (but still very important) element of refereeing. This is an area the Association will look at more closely next year and try to encourage the referees to voluntarily gain more AR experience before the finals.

Final congratulations go to all the year-end award winners. They were all deserving recipients in what was a very competitive field.

On a personal note it was very rewarding to be named the recipient of the Jim Healy Clubman of the Year Award. I thank all members for their support during the year, and for those that thought somehow I was worthy to be bestowed such an honour. It was truly humbling, and on the presentation evening it caught me on the back foot and left me speechless as I thought any of the other nominees (Anne and Rob Nelson, Bill Teece, Adam Parker) were equally, or more so, worthy to receive the award as they dedicate so much to refereeing and the Association. I was so surprised that I sadly neglected to thank the many people that helped me during the year. I was grateful to be given support and advice from many experienced people during the year and I particularly like to thank; David Fryer, Wilf Hedly, Ian Glasgow, the entire coaches and mentors group, Anne Nelson, Bill Teece, Mark Snow, Ian "Shooey" Schubert, Brett Bowden, all in the executive committee, but especially my partner-in-crime, Owen Keane, who is my sounding board and keeps me well grounded! I'm sorry I did not recognise you all on the evening.

In 2014 I will be more time-poor than ever with work and family commitments and a desire to use what leisure time I'll have to concentrate on my own refereeing, as a result I have decided to stand down from this role. I wish the new holder of this position all the very best of luck. I still look forward to being involved with the Association, but in some other, less formal, capacity.

Brumbies Rugby Referees Department Report

Introduction

Given Canberra's transient population each season we say farewell to a large number of match officials interstate and overseas for university, work or a gap year. This included from our senior ranks Dom McCarthy to Sydney, Craig de Boos to the US, Glen Piazza to Wollongong and Andrew Edelman to Queensland. We also had a number of referees who retired, notably David Kimber (312 games) and Stephen Rumble (207 games) and are extremely grateful for the years of contribution they have made to the game. These departures create opportunities for others with Liam King, Rohan Nishantha and Brad Dale being elevated to the A panel and refereeing their 1st first grade premier match. Congratulations to Brad for his BAR trophy award. We also welcomed back experienced referees Greg Corin, Robin Petersen and James Waddington. Greg Saphin and Bill Teece were welcome additions to the senior referee coaching ranks.

The pre-season seminar was again split into senior panel and junior panel on separate days with specific content to cater for experience. For the seniors, Andrew Lees (ARU national panel Super 15 and former ACT referee) gave a presentation on the four core attributes of an elite referee, the profile of which is underpinned by effective decision making, change behaviour, empathy with the players including game understanding and key personal attributes. Russell Ingram, as the Premier 1st grade Royals coach shared his insight into attack and defensive patterns of play. The educational content was well received by attendees and the ability to recognise effective and ineffective skill in contact and who is under pressure was recognised as a key part of making good decisions as an official.

Smart rugby was also delivered at both senior and junior pre-season seminars. Clarity was provided in IRB best practice sanctions related to lifting the legs past the horizontal to ensure player safety. Concussion protocols were also explained, including the role of the referee to recognise potential symptoms and ensure player welfare is paramount.

The Brumbies Rugby Referees' Department staff positions continued similar to last year with a part-time (3 days a week) Referee Development Officer and a full time Rugby Services Administrator who is tasked with operational administration across community rugby.

Recruitment and Retention of Referees

In 2013, our referee numbers increased slightly from 212 to 214, despite losing 42 match officials from the previous year, 21 of which moved interstate or overseas and 6 referees retiring. 4 decided to take a year off, 3 of whom had injuries. 11 had other interests/commitments of which 4 no longer wanted to referee any more, 2 due to abuse. The total number of ACTRRA accredited Level 1 Referees is 91 with 55 Level 2 or 3 Referees. Those that are listed as part accredited (70) are formally registered ACT referees from courses run.

Initiatives for recruiting referees in 2013 continued similar to previous years but included a mail out to all players 13 and above and a recruitment drive at ANU and University of Canberra. I am again grateful to members who helped out at the junior rego day and meet the players' day especially Rob Boyes, Dennis Beissner and Jeff Stone who manned the tent and signed up some new parent referees.

As part of the Student scholarship program, Rugby World Cup final referee Craig Joubert presented referee jerseys before a home super 15 game. This was followed up by addressing the respective schools and presenting their tracksuits. This continues to be an excellent recruitment tool. Advertisements for courses were also published in the Brumbies Super 15 game program and local Stampede as well as the internet and the B-mail which is circulated to all members.

Three foundation courses were run in 2013, two in Canberra and one in Wagga Wagga. The Wagga Wagga course was a dedicated referee course and included level 1 Assistant Referee content. This continues to be a major reason for the



healthy increase in numbers in Southern Inland as well as a competition drive requiring clubs, especially in outer lying areas, to put forward participants to referee. The ARU have now changed the content of the foundation course so that referee and coaching participants work together in the morning and then split to their specialised areas. This worked well and we now have a course that has the right balance for prospective referees. The ARU will also be bringing in a new policy requiring all level 1 aspiring referees to attend the Foundation Course and be at least 15 years old unless exceptional circumstances justify referees being fast tracked. What we have seen works well is to set the age of commencing refereeing at 13 and seeing how they progress in their first year. If, in their second year, they demonstrate the capacity to referee U13s the policy should not be an impediment to progressing their development. The additional requirement however will be to attend the Foundation course and given the change in the balance of content we are confident this will lead to positive development outcomes.

In 2013, four referees were recruited from Foundation courses in Canberra. Our most successful recruitment course in 2013 was again the national Refereeing Kids course which combines smart rugby with refereeing junior modified laws. When run at schools this includes, where possible, a practical session allowing participants to test what they have learnt by refereeing a junior trial match - typically U10s. Refereeing Kids courses were held at the Brumbies Club (3), Marist College, Canberra Grammar, St Edmunds College, Trinity College Goulburn, Daramalan College, ARU National Gold Squad and Narooma.

With 98 participants attending the refereeing kids course in 2013, 44 (50% conversion rate as per 2012) went on to referee. This includes 7 development officers/students who helped out running gala days and 19 who officiated at evening rugby competitions. We continue to work towards achieving at least 1 referee for every 2 teams each club/school provides in the competition and Canberra Grammar and Marist are leading the way in this regard with 18 and 15 referees respectively – with a healthy contribution from Trinity Goulburn, most of whom referee in the Fizzy Reds Friday night competition. We are starting to produce a balance of referee numbers in each year group with healthy numbers in Years 8, 9 and 10 coming through.

Effectiveness of Strategies to reduce Match Official Abuse

As with previous years, the Abuse matrix highlighting levels of abuse and recommended action was reinforced by ACT Rugby Referees Association (ACTRRA) in partnership with the ACT Junior Rugby Union (ACTJRU) and ACT&SNSW Rugby Union. The number of incidents dropped in the senior competition and reflected a strong judiciary stance on this issue. The junior incidents of abuse from team management is concerning given the ARU code of conduct and smart rugby asks coaches and managers to be supportive of match officials and not question decisions openly. Further emphasis will be required in 2014 and the "if you see yellow stay mellow" campaign returned and reinforced with the assistance of the ACTJRU.

Referee Appointments Administration

The Brumbies Office continued to provide an administrative appointments service following a grading/games list for each referee as well as taking into consideration logistical constraints. The ACTJRU restructured their timings of games in 2012 to help accommodate new referees and their playing commitments. This continued in 2013. However, given the number of new referees who are typically playing U13 and U14 it can be quite challenging to give regular refereeing appointments to all, especially if there are only one or two fixtures at a number of grounds. The school/club gala days certainly help in the appointments process. The Brumbies Rugby administration reduces the amount of time and commitment placed on volunteers and provides a less daunting succession plan for future members taking on the appointments role. The Senior Coaching and Grading Chair and U19 Junior Panel Chair are given access to the online appointments database which allows them to determine how much input they choose to provide.



Referee Development

Courses

The Refereeing Kids course again was the mainstay of the courses rolled out in 2013. The Foundation course as mentioned is now more applicable to referees and the participant numbers are expected to grow significantly in the coming years.

A level 2 Referee course was held over one weekend in February involving 14 participants and dovetailed in with the senior pre-season seminar. The course was well received and included sessions from Scott Izod, Brett Bowden and Russell Ingram. We very much appreciate their contribution to these courses.

A level 1 referee coach course planned for early 2013 did not proceed for logistical reasons. There will certainly be one in 2014 to build up referee coaching numbers and translate those that are helping mentor junior referees into accredited referee coaches. The level 2 referee coach course is now being centrally run by the ARU. This is a very successful approach as it ensures a workable number of participants and ensures a consistent education approach using very experienced ARU referee coaches. Greg Saphin and Bill Teece gained considerable value out of attending this course and those that feel they need to refresh their accreditation are encouraged to attend also.

Assistant Referee & Touch Judging

Due to the RDO being part-time, the role of conducting Level 1 and Level 2 Assistant Referee courses in 2013 was again sought from the ACTRRA membership. Sam Whittle kindly conducted the course again this year. The feedback from the participants was again very complimentary. Paul Deans also assisted with assistant refereeing in Southern Inland. Our thanks to Sam and Paul for their ongoing positive contribution.

Education Meetings

The format for the meetings was again similar to previous years with the venue coinciding with Tuesday training at Canberra Grammar School. The ACTRRA executive again did an excellent job in organising a BBQ and drinks for these events. Training was run by Brett Bowden and those that attended, especially the tough Tuesday fitness sessions, gained significant benefit. These are always delivered by Brett very professionally and cater for all levels of fitness.

A referee development program for the education nights was again organised by Brett Bowden and myself early in the year and included competition video footage to cover key focus areas. Assistant referee content was included as required. The feedback from those meetings has been very positive and I am extremely grateful to Brett for all his efforts not just for ACT members but also Southern Inland referees. Brett and Scott made a special trip to Wagga to upskill the referees in that region and it was certainly appreciated. Thanks go to Owen Keane for his co-ordination of the venue, Heather Whittle for feeding the participants, ACTRRA members for helping out and Canberra Grammar for providing the venue. A referee coaches education program was also driven by Scott Izod. Scott provided some excellent content and through his ARU national championships head coach role was able to share some very helpful coaching tips to those that attended. These are very worthwhile education session.

Mentoring/Coaching

I would like to thank Dennis Beissner as Chair of U19 panel referees for coordinating the coaching and mentoring of a large number of new and developing referees in the junior ranks. The "Whistler" was a very good initiative and it certainly kept match officials and parents informed of expectations and best practice. Dennis was ably assisted by fellow cohorts of experienced referees helping others out. We have a growing list of people helping out now and we are so grateful for all their mentoring and coaching.

The IT work undertaken by Vathsala Ramasundara has been much appreciated through building a Stables tracking software that brings together appoints information, ARU MyRugbyAdmin (MRA) and coach/mentor thumbnails into



one portal. This has significant benefits from retention and development of referees and providing opportunities for more ACTRRA members to help out in a productive way.

Development

The Student Scholarship Scheme (SSS) under the ARU Referee Education Framework was coordinated by myself as RDO and Scott Izod and also Robert Paloni who also kindly assisted in the interview of potential candidates. This formal program included Super 15 No.6 duties, ACT representative games, one-on-one video review sessions and closer on-field coaching. This continues to be a very important development program for succession planning. Brock Logue (Brindabella Christian College), Jarrod Loadsman (St Edmunds College), Sam Quirke (St Mary's MacKillop) Jack Phillips (St Peters Broulee) and Jo Whyte (Marist College) were SSS recipients in 2013. All made very good progress in 2013. In memory of Will Boyle, the Will Boyle award for the most outstanding scholarship referee deservedly went to Jo Whyte. It was again lovely to have Will's parents, Peter and Stephanie, at the ACTRRA dinner and we continue to be spurred on through the wonderful and happy memories we have of Will.

As mentioned at the beginning of this report, 2013 was again expected to be a tough year with the loss of experienced referees. Ian Schubert as Senior Coaching and Grading chair was extremely efficient in undertaking the appointments especially when given full access to the online appointments database. Ian was very fair and thorough, putting in many hours of hard work. Brumbies Rugby are very appreciative of his contribution as well as Dennis Beissner in the junior grades. Both step aside next year but they will continue to be very strong contributors to the association. Whilst we were less successful at bringing through new referees into the senior panel in 2013, we continue to have good numbers at the level 2 course and our hope is to progress a number through next year to bolster the senior panel ranks. Our thanks go to the referee coaches who mentored and willing assisted referees throughout the season.

National Selections

ACT representation at ARU National Championships continued. Dominic McCarthy who moved to Sydney for university refereed in the U18 championships which was head coached by Scott Izod. Well done to both for their involvement and ARU recognition. Brad Dale and Liam King were selected for the Darwin 7s and both acquitted themselves very well. Brad went on to referee at the U16 national championships.

Super 15 officials for No.4 and 5 roles in 2013 were performed by Robert Paloni, Damien McLachlan, Brad Dale, Liam King, Rohan Nishantha, Owen Keane, Rob Boyes, Denis Beissner and Benjamin Nelson. Peter Janssens took over the Super Rugby Match Official liaison officer for the ARU. I'm sure incoming referees enjoyed jumping into PJs builders van!

Concluding Remarks

In the Brumbies office, Craig Leseberg took over from Bill Milward as Community Rugby Manager at the end of 2012 season and I thank him for his leadership and ongoing support.

Caitlin Ryan as Appointments Administrator had the extremely challenging job of dealing with last minute game changes, pull outs and logistical requests. She often worked late on Monday and Tuesday to complete the 1st draft. We hope there will be some streamlining of the process with the assistance of ACTJRU and ACTRRA next season so that the junior panel referees receive their final appointments on time. Again, it is a mammoth task and our thanks to our referees for their patience. Thanks Caitlin for your efforts which are typically behind the scenes and often not known or appreciated.

Anne Nelson continued her role as the liaison officer for referee matters on the ACTJRU committee and we thank her for the contribution she made to keep people informed. Bill and Angus Teece again did an excellent job of coordinating referees at Canberra Stadium for the Finals. Thanks also to Wilf and Ian Glasgow for running events at Uni-Norths and Greg Saphin for again co-originating the referees at the junior 7s carnival.



Dennis Beissner and Owen Keane continue to make constructive improvements to the ACTRRA website and online red card and abuse reporting processes. I thank the ACTRRA Executive for their work also. There are two notable mentions I would like to end with. Mick Cleary without doubt has been one of the stalwarts of ACT refereeing and after 24 years with the whistle reached the milestone of 500 games. I'm sure he has many more games in him and to acknowledge the tremendous contribution he has made I have listed the timeline of his achievements. What is humbling is that Mick gains more satisfaction out of encouraging and helping other referees than personal recognition. Of a similar mindset, and I hope he does not mind me saying, David Fryer turns 80 years young at the end of this year. David has been an inspiration to so many referees and never fails to enthuse and encourage people in such a positive way. Many happy returns David.

Referee Administrator's Report

The 2013 ACT/Monaro rugby season began in early April and concluded in early September in the ACT and regional areas of Taralga, Crookwell, Jindabyne, Bungendore, Boorowa, Cooma, Goulburn, Yass and Broulee.

Senior appointments were sent out on a Monday and updated throughout the week as required, whilst the initial junior appointments were made available for review by the junior appointments co-ordinator each Tuesday. Depending on required junior game and appointment changes these were emailed out on a Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday and final appointments sent on Thursdays and Fridays. Some appointments weren't sent out until late on a Friday afternoon to cover gaps, and I thank the many referees who were happy to fill in at the last minute. Grounds that had a large number of games scheduled on a weekend usually had all matches covered as many referees were also playing there or had family members who were there. Unfortunately, the smaller grounds sometimes had games unappointed to as they had fewer matches scheduled and so fewer referees to choose from who were already at the grounds due to their playing commitments.

There were a total of 422 senior and 995 junior referee appointments as well as 405 AR/#4/#5 competition appointments over this period. Of note were contributions from Rob Whyte (11 junior and 17 senior appointments, an official involvement in 40 matches during the year), Chase Loadsman (25 junior appointments), and Joe Whyte (24 junior appointments). Thanks also to Rob Boyes and Brad Dale, for being a match official in 36 and 33 matches respectively. These referees and many others also assisted in Waratah Shield, ACT Griffins and Colts representative matches and other mid-week games. Most weekends, 22 senior matches and 87 junior matches were played.

Each week referees made the effort to travel to regional matches. I would like to acknowledge Mick Toirkens for travelling to referee on 17 occasions, and Steve Peak for travelling out of Canberra to referee on 13 occasions. Thanks also to all the referees living in regional areas who refereed multiple matches on weekends where we were short in their area.

We implemented the ARU's online referee registration process for the first time this year after a trial in 2012. There were still a number of technical problems which slowed the process, but now that these issues have been resolved we will be using the ARU's updated MRA system in 2014.

The number of occasions where a referee had more than one appointment in the same day was lower than last year, with 113 occasions over the season. The availability of junior referees who also had playing commitments and the lack of older more experienced referees in the junior panels was a problem again this year. There was again an influx of new referees in the Junior E Panel which meant that in the older age groups there were unappointed matches, but there was a surplus in the younger ones. This meant that new referees, despite their enthusiasm, were not given an appointment each week. Due to the problems with the online registrations early in the junior season, some U8s and U9s matches were left unappointed.

Thanks to Ian Schubert (senior appointments) and Dennis Beissner (junior appointments) for their contribution. Thanks lastly to Mark Snow (Brumbies Referee Development Officer) for all his help during the year.

Treasurers report

The ACT Rugby Referee's Association began the 2012/2013 financial year with \$735 in the bank, however the adjusted figure was about \$6900. Overall, it was a tougher year financially with expenses, particularly from additional exchanges, out weighing income. Even though the ACTRRA finished with just over \$7100 in the bank, accounting for outstanding invoices to be settled in 2013/2014, the adjusting balance is \$3361. The Will Boyle Memorial Fund finished the financial year at a balance of \$7385.

Money In

We again received a sponsorship grant from CEA technologies, however with little notice they downgraded the amount from \$3000 to \$2500. Our major fundraising event this year was once again our participation in the grand final's catering day. Similar to last year it was again agreed we would undertake the catering alongside the Vikings Club Restaurant. As the weather was good again this year, the association received \$3700, with only minimal participation required from our members. Other significant contributions were the \$500 catering day bonus from the ACT Rugby Union. The association received \$700 from the raffle of a 2013 signed Brumbies jersey and a silent auction at the Annual Presentation Dinner. Clothing sales also produced an unexpected profit of \$1150, mostly due to Tsunamis' mistake regarding the tracksuit pants. This year the ACT Rugby Union also underwrote the Annual Presentation Dinner to the sum of \$2500.

Money Out

The two biggest expenses for the association this year were the development exchanges and fitness training. The association funded outgoing exchanges to New Zealand, the Darwin 7s and the Southern Inlands at a cost of \$4050. No exchange lunch was held for the visiting New Zealand exchange referees and coaches this year, however the association funded a car for them at a cost of \$310. Training was also successfully continued with Brett Bowden again running sessions on Tuesday and Thursday nights at a cost of \$5480. We continued holding BBQs on development nights and the preseason seminars, covering the costs of these evenings was about \$558. I would like to thank Heather Whittle for undertaking to source and supply the food for some of these BBQs. The association held the Annual Presentation Dinner at the Southern Cross Club in Jamison this year. Attendance was down slightly, with about 78 people in attendance. The ACT Rugby Union subsidy allowed us to again offer members cheaper tickets, which helped keep numbers up. However, the association need to cover more costs this year and subsequently ran at a loss for the evening.
