Presidents Report

It gives me great pleasure to provide the 2017 ACT Rugby Referees Association's (ACTRRA) President's Report for the information of members.

I would personally like to thank members of the 2017 ACTRRA Executive for an outstanding year, namely:

- James Hagen (Vice President);
- Chad Burnell (Secretary);
- James Morris (Assistant Secretary); and
- Robin Petersen (Treasurer).

The Executive has work together to provide a stable leadership group and set the foundations for the coming years. Having only been a member of the Association for three years, I have drawn heavily on their experience, knowledge and advice throughout the year. The strength of the current Executive has come from our ability to have open, honest and robust discussions around issues and the direction of ACTRRA in a positive manner. This is further evident by there being no turnover of executive members during the season and all current executive members intending to nominate for their current positions in 2018.

Special mention must go to Chad who has carried a majority of the workload as Secretary and was literally single headedly responsible for our fantastic presentation night this year. The amount of work and effort Chad has put in has been impressive, combine this with his performance on the paddock is a significant achievement and on behalf of the Executive and members I thank him for his efforts.

I see the Referee Coach Committee playing an important role in driving the continual development of ACTRRA Referee Coaches at all levels and bringing new Referee Coaches into the fold.

The Rugby Services Administrator role is a thankless job and we are greatly appreciative to Brumbies for their support.

This year is the second year where ACTRRA has not had a Referee Development Officer (RDO) following our false start at the end of 2016. This is an unfortunate situation which has and is impacting upon ACTRRA referee development. I acknowledge the support provided by Brumbies Rugby and the Australian Rugby Union (ARU) in providing training opportunities, which as an association we have not taken full advantage off and members need to take some responsibility for their own development and make themselves available when opportunities present.

I suggest the absence of an RDO will not change in the short to medium future; as such ACTRRA needs to accept this and work internally on strategies for managing the development of 'our' referees and look to create opportunities to support this.

Finally, looking towards the future in 2018, it is import to understand the journey of the past two years. In 2016, it was the focus of Executive to build and strengthen our relationships with our external stakeholders through stability within the Association and provide confidence to the wider rugby community.

In 2017, the focus of the Executive was to capitalising on efforts of 2016 in securing long term sponsors and building robust processes around Senior Panel referees in respect to development opportunities.

In 2018, the 2017 ACTRRA Executive has set the foundations for the focus to be on 'Junior Panel' referees in respect to recruitment, retention, development opportunities and support to the CGAC in this area.

Coaching, Grading and Appointments Chairman's Report

It is never about the referees, it is always about the players and the game.

It is a great year if all that is spoken of after the grand finals are the tries, tackles, scrums and plays! After both the Senior and Junior grand finals there have been no complaints or hard conversations to be had about the standard of refereeing - so it appears ACTRRA got it right.

A major issue raised last year was the spread of coaching reports across the Association's referees. Further investigation revealed that those numbers were disproportionately reflective of self reviews under the GPR system (where a referee completes their own review without a Referee Coach being nominated). This year, the Referee Coaches made it a focus to "share the love" and actively increase the number of referees that were reviewed during the season. Using RRIMS/Sideline as a marker (there are many reports done on paper or thumbnails not included in here that I believe show a much clearer picture across the juniors in particular):

- 2016 – 147 reports/GPRs by 12 coaches on 43 different referees; and
- 2017 – 147 reports/GPRs by 19 coaches on 64 different referees.

This represents a significant improvement both in terms of the number of coaches actively involved and the number of referees seen. I would like to thank all the coaches that gave up their weekends to sit in the cold and wet to help improve our game. I would like to take this opportunity to especially acknowledge Jack Cunningham who facilitated the re-enlistment of the "Old and Bold" and Greg Saphin who covered the country run! The addition of Sarah and Nathan to our coaching cadre has been a god send and the figures above would have been even better if Sarah could work out how to use a computer!

There were no First Grade debuts this year as we focussed on further developing some of last year's SSS referees and bringing them into the senior ranks with great showings in particular from Mitch Beissner and Reuben Keane. I would like to congratulate Brodie Ingram, Reuben Keane and James Hagan for being recognised with higher honours this year at the National Schoolboy's Championships and the Central Coast 7s

While refereeing is mostly an individual sport, most of our members are ex-players looking for a team environment. It has been particularly enjoyable to see our senior referees lead and increase the team feel in ACTRRA with the additional training opportunities through the Brumbies Rugby in the pre-season and Form Fitness during the season to compliment the training provided by Brett Bowden.

Changes in transparency through the Junior grading system has been introduced by Owen Keane with the invention of his "report card" - ranking referees against the ARU's Refereeing profile. Our focus for next year is to still improve the amount of coaching available to our Junior ranks as we look to find ways to fill the void due to the lack of a Referee Development Officer.

On a personal note, I was left somewhat disappointed by the reaction of some of our team to our Junior Grand Final appointments. The method and reasons were covered at Development Night, with all members invited and I, as Chairman, being available to discuss them. Chastising the hardworking volunteers that tirelessly do more than referee or coach, particularly in public, is not acceptable. To reiterate my earlier statement "*It is never about the referees, it is always about the players and the game*". Our philosophy is to put the best Referee available for a game on that game. The teams train and play all year to hopefully come away with the chocolates and they deserve the best we have.



In true Bowdo tradition, I too would like to finish on a positive. Without the tireless efforts of Geoff Palmer and Dennis Beissner shuffling bodies around the appointments spreadsheets, we would have likely not had a competition this year. The guys doing the appointments are the unseen but often blamed team members that make it happen – THANK YOU gents!!!

U19 Coaching and Grading Coordinators Report

2017 and another year without a formal Referee Development Officer. There is little doubt this continues to hurt our association. The highlight of a very challenging year was the addition of three adult referees in the juniors ranks. Without these adult referees we would have seen up to five U16/U15 games without a referee every weekend. By the conclusion of the season, regional and small clubs were regularly managing games without appointed referees. Unappointed games are becoming a regular occurrence as our numbers fall to critical levels. A significant change, forced onto the junior appointments team due to lack of numbers, was the formal appointment of referees to more than one game junior game in a day. By the end of the season 3-4 referees were consistently doing 3 or 4 games every Saturday. Unfortunately, there was some anecdotal evidence that fatigue started to be a factor in the later games. Referee coaches and yellow card reports both indicate a lower tolerance and increased use of punitive escalations, as the game count increased.

Scholarship and Watch Group Referees

A quiet year for ARU Scholarship Referees, with ACTRRA only selecting one referee for the program. Due to injuries and availability Alex only managed a handful of regular season games, but contributed well when he did make the field. The group of potential Scholarship referees is relatively small but strong.

Finals and Grand Final Games

The Coaching and Grading Committee chose to use the “strongest referee gets the game” model and that followed through into the junior ranks. Seniors referees made up a significant proportion of grand final appointments for games above the U14 age group. This has the effect of sliding very capable junior referees down to games often well below their regular season appointment level but also puts ACTRRAs best referees onto the paddock. The methodology really does work and our junior finals weekend was very successful from a refereeing perspective.

Grading

In the second year of the junior *Referee Report Card* we slightly modified the wording of the rating to recognise the learning process of young referees. At the conclusion of the season we also sent every referee a copy of their only grades, unfortunately some misunderstanding and poor communication by myself meant some referees did not see this as a positive step forward.

For transparency and accountability, I firmly believe the Report Card is still very useful but the membership will need to be provided a better explanation of the system and the process.

Wrap up

Thanks to all the referee coaches for their tireless efforts at watching and helping our young and not-so young referees. A massive thank you to Dennis Beissner, Josh Walsh and Zac Elliot who all made the sometimes-fragile system of junior appointments work so well.

Brumbies Rugby - Referee Department Report

Season 2017 saw some movement at the Brumbies Rugby Department with Zac Elliott leaving the position of Rugby Services Administrator to take up the Southern Inland Rugby Union Development Officer role in Wagga Wagga. Halfway through the season in June, Josh Walsh took over the role with Brumbies Rugby. The Referee Development Officer position that has in the past looked after NSW and the ACT is still currently vacant. Due to the recent decline in referee numbers over the past couple of years, this role would be a valuable resource to focus on the recruitment and development of referees and both Brumbies Rugby and the ARU are continuing to have discussions around this space. Brodie Ingram has continued his part time role within the Brumbies running the Junior Education courses over the year.

2017 provided a number of opportunities for ACTRRA members to get out and referee outside of the normal senior and junior competition matches each weekend.

These events were a great reward for those referees to get a chance to referee in front of some big crowds and exciting atmospheres.

Some of these events included VIVA7's games at the pre-game and half-time of the Wallabies v Argentina test match on the 16th September at GIO Stadium. Also, involvement in Brumbies home games, Uni North juniors & Queanbeyan seniors 7's tournaments and multiple representative programs and friendly matches throughout the year.

Recruitment and Retention

In 2017, ACTRRA had a total of 114 registered referee members, with 6 of these being life members. This number is moderately down on last year's numbers of 146 registered referees, with 8 life members.

There were 82 referees retained from 2016 with a total of 32 new referees for the 2017 season, 20 of these new members were under the age of 18. There will be a major focus on retaining as many referees from 2017 as possible and recruiting new referees for the 2018 season.

Brodie Ingram continued his work with Brumbies Rugby in recruitment this year and ran 6 Refereeing Kids Rugby courses this year.

These courses were completed at a number of different venues including Marist College, Goulburn, Broulee/Batemans Bay, Queanbeyan and two courses at Brumbies HQ.

There was a total of 70 people who attended these courses over the 6 separate events.

Brodie will again be working with these in the recruitment and development space over the preseason. These are very important courses to run and there will be a big push next year to get as many people as possible who attend these events to register as ACTRRA members and get them on the field in 2018.

APPOINTMENTS

For the 2017 season the Senior referee appointments were coordinated by Geoff Palmer & Steve Peak, and the Junior referee appointments were run by Owen Keane & Dennis Beissner.

The appointments process is a very time consuming and difficult task each week. It's probably an unappreciated job at times but many thanks need to go to these men for coordinating all the appointments and making sure there was a referee at as many games as possible during the season.

Throughout the year, the senior appointments ran quite smoothly with most games not changing much from the original drafts. As always with the Juniors there was a few late changes each but we all did our best to reduce the amount of unallocated games.

We would really like to thank any referee who volunteered to fill in at the last minute to cover games with some people refereeing multiple games over the weekend.



Although there was around 30 less referees this year, it is a credit to the current referee members and appointment coordinators that there was an increase in senior games allocations & total game allocations for the whole year and only a 0.08% decrease in the amount of allocations for junior games compared to 2016.

Brumbies Rugby Referee Department would like to thank Geoff, Steve Owen & Dennis for all their tireless hard work throughout the year.

EDUCATION AND TRAINING

Over the year, a number of educational programs and courses were run by Brumbies Rugby and the ARU. There will be a large focus next year of targeting younger referees and getting new referees on the field.

There were 2 foundation courses held at Brumbies HQ and another one is planned to run on the 19th November. The first was held on March 19th, the same day as the ACTRRA Senior pre-season seminar which also included Blue Card training. This was run by Jamie MacGregor from the ARU. There was a total of 23 people who attended this course which is a great result. The second ran on June 4th and had a total of 11 attendees. There are already 10 names down as attending for the course in November.

We also had 2 members from ACTRRA that made the trip up to Sydney during the middle of the year to attend a Referee Coach Level 2 workshop, they were also joined by a SIRU member.

At the beginning of the year, the ARU introduced the initiative of the Blue Card trial that took place in competitions in Canberra and Newcastle. The blue card will enforce stricter regulations on concussed players and allows referees to send off a player if they are showing signs of concussion.

On the 12th April, there was Player Welfare and Safety Initiative Information Seminar around the Blue Card Trial held at Brumbies HQ. It was available to all junior and senior referees and was presented by the ARU Chief Medical Officer Warren MacDonald and the ARU's Referee Education Manager Jamie MacGregor.

The trial proved very successful and the blue card will continue to be used in the Canberra competitions and also introduced to the NRC and Aon Uni 7s in 2018.

As mentioned previously, Brodie Ingram was again working with Brumbies Rugby for the Junior Referee Education. We would like to thank Brodie for his hard work again this year.

Brumbies Rugby would like to thank everyone that was involved in the educational programs, workshops and courses over the year.

DEVELOPMENT

Training runs were held by ACTRRA each Tuesday night at Canberra Grammar School. These nights were used to keep fit as a group throughout the year. There were also Development Nights were held on the first Tuesday of every month. These nights involved reviewing videos of matches throughout the year and discussing with each other about key areas of focus for the referees. These nights are a great way for our referees to develop their knowledge and experience with real life footage and examples.

They were also used to meet other referees and help each other develop individually and as a collective group of referees.

Training and development nights allow for the referees to learn, and get feedback from their peers. Brumbies Rugby would like to thank everyone involved in making these events happen so our referees can continue to learn and improve.
